Princeton University Climbing Wall Use Agreement

Princeton University's climbing wall is located in the Stadium and is operated by the Outdoor Action Program ("OA"), staff and trained OA student leaders. Outdoor Action is Princeton University's outdoor education and leadership program.

- 1. I hereby acknowledge and agree that the sport of rock climbing and the use of Princeton University's Outdoor Action Climbing Wall at Princeton University have inherent risks. I appreciate the nature and extent of the risks associated with rock climbing and the use of the Climbing Wall, including, but not limited to:
 - All manner of injury resulting from falling off the Climbing Wall and impacting against rock faces and projections, other climbers or equipment, or the floor.
 - Rope abrasion, entanglement, and other injuries resulting from activities on or near the Climbing Wall such as, but not limited to climbing, belaying, rappelling, lowering on rope, rescue systems, and any other rope techniques.
 - Injuries resulting from falling climbers or dropped items, such as, but not limited to, ropes or climbing hardware.
 - Cuts and abrasions resulting from skin contact with the Climbing Wall.
 - Failure of ropes, slings, harnesses, climbing hardware, anchor points, or any part of the Climbing Wall.
- 2. I am unaware of any health issues or physical limitations which would preclude my safe use of the Climbing Wall (subject to the inherent risks referenced above).
- 3. If I provide any of my own equipment for climbing including, but not limited to: harness, shoes, ropes, carabiners, and other climbing hardware, I accept full responsibility for it's use and full responsibility for the safety of any other climbers who use this equipment.
- 4. I hereby agree to follow all posted regulations concerning use of the Climbing Wall including those outlined below as well as the instructions of the Climbing Wall staff. I understand that failure to follow all of the required policies and procedures can result in my losing all privileges at the Climbing Wall. I agree to adhere to the following policies for using the Climbing Wall as well as any other policies either posted at the Climbing Wall or instructed to me by Climbing Wall staff.
 - No unbelayed climbing above the Red Line on any section of the Wall. This means that no body part may be placed above the Red Line at any time.
 - All climbers and belayers are required to wear a professionally manufactured harness designed for climbing. Harnesses must utilize a double-back system to secure the harness at the waist. Climbers must tie directly into the rope using a figure 8 follow through.
 - Belaying is to be done using an ATC or similar belay device.

- No alterations of any kind may be made to the Wall except by authorized Climbing Wall staff.
- Climbing is only permitted during scheduled open hours or under supervision of official OA Climbing Wall staff.
- The Wall is for the use of members of the Princeton University community (students, faculty, and staff, children and spouses). Children of University members may climb only with a parent present.
